Proposal for the creation of a Tourism Director Position

Tourism is a Global force for Good!

Objective:

To create a new Tourism Director position, using room Tax dollars. A position that works with the City of Caliente, the Room Tax Board and creative partners. To Create an active and sustainable Marketing Plan and a new Visitors Bureau. This will help to grow and prosper Caliente and its businesses, therefore helping to strengthen our economy and quality of life.

Purpose of Tourism: To promote, showcase and advertise all of our areas products and services to Tourists/Visitors.

★ Accomodations, Hospitality, Transport Services, Guided Tours and Tourist guides, Travel Agencies and reservation Services, Cultural Services, Sports and Recreational Activities and Retail Sales.

Reports to: The Caliente City Council and Room Tax / Visitor Bureau Board.

Position purpose: To help create, plan, develop, organize, photograph, implement and coordinate the annual Tourism marketing plan and conduct the day to day business operations of the New, Caliente Tourism Board position.

Funding Source: The Callente Room Tax Board

Position is considered as a part time contract worker.

- ★ Start up: \$26,000 First Year. To be re-negotiated in one year.
- ★ \$2,166 per month
- ★ Insurance to be discussed
- ★ To begin in December, Payment every 15th of the month(?)

- ★ Creation of a 12 month Event/Activity Calendar
- ★ Classes to help educate businesses (Social Media, Advertising and Promotions)
- ★ Yearly Social Media Campaign
- ★ Create Media Files- (Photography, Ads for facebook, Instagram and Website)
- ★ Create stories and advertorials for magazines, (Encouraging area freelance writers, photographers and High school students)
- ★ Teach and encourage real old fashloned Hospitality
- ★ Creation and promotion of several new "Annual "events
- ★ Creation of Itineraries for Tour Groups
- ★ Host Fam Tours

Responsibilities continued

The Director of Tourism is responsible for the operations of the CVB in an efficient and cost-effective manner. The Director of Tourism will also assist in coordinating marketing efforts with area partners such as LCAT and the LCEDA

I. Marketing .

- ★ Develop and Implement the annual marketing plan of tourism development and promotion for the Caliente Visitors Bureau, subject to the CVB Advisory Board approval.
- ★ Assist and help provide content and photographs for City website and area businesses when and where appropriate and asked.
- ★ Creation of ads and commercials, subject to extra costs for production.
- * Adopt a program of hospitality with Ambassadors of Good Will, Tea Mistresses and Young ambassadors (High school Seniors, Community)
- ★ Host VIP Events, Create High Teas, Photo safaris, concerts in the park series, Bike tours, Horse, Car and Motorcycle shows, Coin, and Antique shows. Food festivals, and start a new annual "Caliente Founders Day/ Rail Road Days" Celebrating Caliente's Birthday in 1901, in 2109 we are 118 years old!
 NOTE: Encourage and teach business and area organizations to create new events
- ★ Assist in the follow up of master listing (marketing plan) of inquiries promoting Callente as a fantastic visitor's destination area.
- ★ Responsible to search out, write and apply for available grant opportunities to assist with achieving marketing goals. Example; The Nevada Commission on Tourism.
- ★ Create and maintain on-going relationships with tour operators, sports organizations, community groups, area businesses, city and chamber leadership and the general public.
- ★ Develop regional marketing opportunities, new events and collaborative efforts to maximize tourism-marketing resources. This includes working with area visitors and meeting facilities and attractions.
- ★ Conduct FAM Tours and represent the Caliente Visitors Bureau at industry functions, conferences, tradeshows, and pre planned local events.
- ★ Coordinate marketing activities of CVB, to include bimonthly newsletters, annual report, member correspondence, press releases, social media and other projects.
- ★ Implement marketing programs/ Activities to include involvement of members.

II. Organizational Management

- ★ Serve as staff llaison and advisor to the Caliente Visitors Bureau Advisory Board and such other committees in a non-voting capacity. Attend board meetings and other Caliente Visitor Bureau functions as deemed appropriate. Prepare the Caliente Visitors Bureau Advisory Board and other committee agendas and keep minutes of meetings. Prepare and distribute meeting materials in a timely manner.
- * Assemble information, conduct research to be prepared for such reports as may be required by the Caliente Visitors Advisory Board (i.e. annual reports, monthly activity reports, monthly financial reports, etc.)
